

## **Distance Learning Expectations:** Students

Distance Learning Days are school days. All assigned material and assignments are expected to be completed and will contribute to your child's overall marking period grade. Listed below are the student expectations during distance learning.

1. Students should attend live Zoom classes at their regularly scheduled time. Teachers will be conducting classes following the same schedule used by students each day.
2. All students are encouraged to complete classwork during the designated class time.  
***\*If you are unable to complete classwork at the designated time, please contact the classroom teacher.***
3. Attending class means completing all assignments posted in the Google Classroom for each class and attending all live Zoom sessions.
4. If a live Zoom session is not available, students should reach out to teachers via GoGuardian chat, email, or Remind.
5. If a live Zoom session is available, students should follow all Distance Learning Expectations while attending live sessions.
6. If students are unable to attend class during the designated class time, all assignments in Google classroom for that day are due by the start of school the next school day.
7. All assignments are expected to be completed on time and can be used in grading.  
\* The teacher will designate which assignments will be used for grading, such as tests, quizzes, or projects. Classwork and homework may also be used in grading.

## **Tips to help your child:**

1. **Set (and keep) a schedule** - The closer this is to a 'school schedule,' the easier it will likely be on everyone.
2. **Make sure they have any materials necessary to complete all assignments** - Your child should have most of the materials they will need to complete their assignments. Be sure they have paper and pencil handy.
3. **Provide an environment conducive to learning** - Help your child find a spot where they can work without being too distracted. The less distractions a student has, the better their chances of completing their assignments.
4. **Work with your child to help them learn** - Do your best to help your child when they are struggling. If an activity becomes too overwhelming, take a break and return to it at a later time. You can also contact the teacher and let them know your child needs help with a specific assignment.
5. **Make sure all work is completed** - At the end of each day, make sure your child has completed all of their assignments and they are properly "Turned In" in the Google Classroom.
6. **Help them check messages and communicate with the teacher** - Whether it is you or your child, be sure to stay in contact with the classroom teacher. Teachers can be reached through email, Remind, GoGuardian, and during live Zoom sessions. The more often you or your child contact the teacher, the easier it will be to complete assignments and get help when you need it.
