Dear Parent/Guardian,

In 2018, the General Assembly passed Act 44 mandating the establishment and use of the “Safe2Say Something” (S2SS) anonymous reporting system by every Pennsylvania school entity.

Similar to Muncy School District’s current Safe School Helpline, S2SS is a school safety program that teaches students, educators, and parents to report information, about individuals who may be at risk of hurting themselves or others, through the S2SS app, website, or 24/7 Crisis Center Hotline.

Unlike Muncy School District’s current Safe School Helpline, the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) will manage and maintain the “Safe2Say Something” (S2SS) reporting system. OAG Crisis Center analysts are trained to receive, evaluate, prioritize and deliver tips to impacted schools and, where needed, local law enforcement via 911 County Dispatch.

The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) will manage and maintain the research-based program in partnership with Sandy Hook Promise (SHP), a nation-wide non-profit organization. SHP’s programs are in 50 states – with 10,000+ schools and over 5.5 million students and adults. Sandy Hook Promise has the track record, reputation, and knowledge for working effectively with kids, parents, and teachers to improve school safety.
