Marlin was an exceptional athlete and was very competitive. He lettered four years in baseball, three years each in football and wrestling, while also picking up one letter in basketball.

In baseball, Marlin pitched and played third base during his High School career. In his 12 year semi-pro baseball career in the West Branch League he also played a solid third base. One baseball fan noted that he had a gun for an arm, was deadly accurate, and made very few errors and that "Wolfie was a very savvy ball player". He also had a .300+ batting average at the plate.

In football Marlin was a two-way performer, quarterbacking and playing safety on defense. He was a good runner, running out of the full house T formation.

In wrestling he had a good career and one fan remembers Marlin being robbed in the District finals as somehow his opponent got credit for his riding time and that cost him the championship at the 127 lb. Classification.

Marlin was also a very good bowler as he averaged over 200 and rolled four perfect 300 games during his career.
