Wendy, a gifted all-around athlete was the first female elected to the Muncy High School Athletic Hall of Fame. Wendy was a four year letter winner in both basketball and tennis.

Wendy scored 881 points during her basketball career which was only 49 games, half of what teams play today. She averaged 18 points per game. She was selected Most Valuable Player in the Montoursville Tournament which the Lady Indians won while also being tabbed for the first team West Branch All-Star team. Wendy played on the Penn State varsity team as a non-scholarship player her freshman year.

Wendy was the No. 1 tennis player all four years she competed for Muncy and was undefeated at 38-0 during that period. As a 9<sup>th</sup> grader Wendy won the District IV mixed doubles with Kent Stiger. They lost in the semi-finals at the PIAA State Tournament. In 10<sup>th</sup> grade Wendy placed second in Districts singles and won a District Title in mixed doubles with Merrill Fisher. She competed in the State Tournament. Her senior year she placed second in the District final,

Wendy also made gender history in 1975 at 12 years old as she was the first girl selected to play Little League baseball in Muncy. She played for American Legion Post 268.
