Jaime was the first girl to reach the coveted 1000 point plateau in Muncy Lady Indian basketball history. Jamie finished with 1506 points during her career, while averaging 14.6 points per game along the way. Statistically, Jamie pulled down 845 rebounds, recorded 240 steals and handed out 102 assists during her four years on the varsity where she started and lettered each and every year. She also was a Co-captain her senior year. Jaime was a key performer on the 1993 team that captured the District IV AA Championship over a tough Troy High School team. Jaime was named to the Mid-Penn All-Star teams all four year of her career. She was honorable mention during her freshman and sophomore campaigns before garnering first team selections in both her junior and senior years. Jaime capped off her stellar career by being selected as Mid-Penn's Most Valuable Player by the league coaches.

During her four years on the hard wood with the Lady Indians her teams posted an overall record of 68-37 and appeared three times in post season play.

Jaime also lettered three years as a Muncy Varsity Football Cheerleader.

Jaime continued her basketball career at Slippery Rock University and lettered in her first and only season that she competed at SRU.
