Christina was an exceptional versatile female athlete who had great leadership skills in any sport she participated in. She was the 1993 Muncy female athlete of the year.

Christina was one of the best point guards to ever play for the Lady Indians. She lettered her soph., jr. and senior years and was a co-captain her senior season. Individually, 2006 and before she held single season (121), and career (249) for assists, single season record for three-point field goals (41) and finished 6<sup>th</sup> in all time scoring with 726 points.

Her senior season ended in a dream scenario. After qualifying for PIAA post season play for the second consecutive season, the Lady Indians capped off a mini-run at the end of the year and then competed in the large AA division as Muncy had the smallest enrollment for that class in the tournament. Muncy first faced Line Mountain who they defeated 44-34 in the semi-finals. Next up was Troy High School who was a strong favorite to win the District Title. The game seesawed back and forth that night at the Magic Dome at Williamsport High School. If you believed in miracles, one happened that March night in 1993, Trailing 58-57 with one second on the clock, young Christina Steinbacher was unbelievably fouled at half court as time expired. Muncy in the bonus situation saw their captain head to the foul line for a one and one opportunity. Miss the first one-Muncy loses, make one, tie and head to overtime, well my friends, that night one of the best clutch performances I've ever seen in watching Muncy sports. Christina hit nothing but net on both shots and the Muncy Lady Indians captured the 1993 District IV Class AA Championship 59-58.

Christina lettered four years in field hockey. Her senior year, Muncy won their most games ever (5) and was competitive in most games and lost a number of one goal games. Offensively she scored five goals and recorded three assists. Christina played one year of college field hockey at Lebanon Valley College and earned a varsity letter.

Christina has coached basketball in the John Bower basketball league the past three years. A bike enthusiast, Christina enjoys long distance rides and has participated in several rides for charity.
