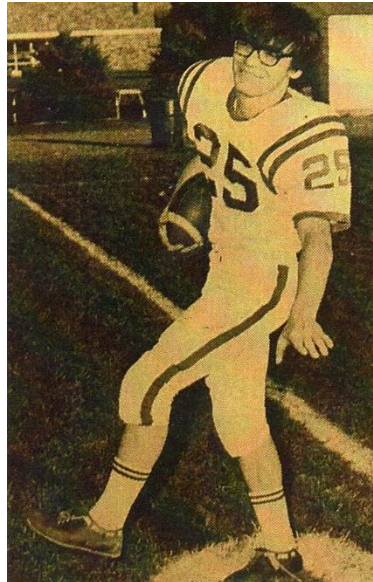


## GALEN MILLER-CLASS OF 1972

### Football-Basketball-Baseball-Officiating-Track



Galen's sports career can be described in one word impressive. From his playing days to coaching, officiating and administration, he's done it all and seen it all.

In high school, Galen lettered in football, 1969, 1970 and 1971. He earned a honorable mention on all-star voting. He lettered three years in track 1969, 1970 and 1972. Galen qualified for districts in 1972 and competed in the high jump, 800 and mile.

Galen lettered in basketball his junior and senior years. He averaged 12.4 points a game, both campaigns. He earned West Branch honorable mention. Additionally in 1971 and 1972 Galen played on the volleyball team and helped lead the 1972 team to a District IV title and a berth in the state tournament at Penn State University.

Galen at Lock Haven State University, lettered three years 1974, 1975 and 1976. He was a first team all-star in 1974 at third base in the Western Conference (PSAC) Conference. His team won the Western Conference in 1976. Galen played third base and compiled a 6-1 record on the mound.

Galen is highly regarded PIAA sports official in District 11 sports, from 2001 to the present school year. In football, baseball, and softball, he's officiated numerous district league championships and Eastern Conference football finals.

Galen was the athletic director/coach at Northwest Area School District. Teams under Galen's direction won multiple District 11 Championships as well as multiple Wyoming Valley Conference Championships in football, field hockey, cross country, softball and track. He served as assistant football and basketball coach.

In the 1970's and 1980's, Galen played on semi-pro baseball teams and softball teams. He was a member of numerous championship teams. He led the 1976 West Branch League Champions Watsontown Pirates in batting average at .540 and also led the pitching staff with a perfect 9-0 record.
