

JUSTIN GRENOBLE-CLASS OF 2001

Football-Baseball-Basketball



Justin was the most versatile athlete from the Class of 2001 having excelled as a three-sport athlete in football, baseball and basketball.

Justin was a three-year letterman for the football team (1998-2000) and was selected as a Team Captain in 2000. He received numerous accolades at the Conference, District and State levels. In 1998, he was selected West Branch Conference Honorable Mention at tight end. The 1999 season highlighted his versatility as he was selected West Branch Conference 1st team at three different positions-tight end, linebacker, and punter in route to leading the Indians to an Eastern Conference Championship. He received state recognition at punter as well having been selected to the All-State 2nd team. In 2000, he put a cap on his stellar football career as he captained his team to the Eastern Conference playoffs being selected as a District IV All-Star and All-State 3rd team punter. Justin was also invited to the Big 33 football camp in 2000. He undoubtedly would have received 1st team all-conference accolades in 2000 as well had the Indians not gone independent that season cutting ties with the West Branch Conference. Justin concluded his football career at Muncy with 71 receptions for 1469 yards and 22 touchdowns.

Justin went on to play college football for the Lycoming Warriors from 2001-2004. He was a three-year letterman for the Warriors (2002-2004) where he put his all-around talents on display at four different positions-tight end, wide receiver, full back, and special teams. In 2003, Justin helped lead the Warriors to the MAC League Championship in route to becoming an Eastern Regional finalist ranked #10 in the nation.

As incredible a career as he had on the gridiron, his numbers on the baseball diamond were equally as impressive. A three-year letterman (1999-2001) and team captain in 2001, Justin racked up a quite a resume. He was part of a District qualifier in each of his four seasons including a Mid-Penn Conference Co-Champion in 1998. Grenoble was a three-time Mid-Penn Conference 1st team selection including the conference MVP in 2001. Additionally, he was chosen as 2001 team MVP and offensive player of the year. Also, during the 2001 campaign, Justin became Muncy's all-time hit king with 86 career knocks. The team went on to hit a school record 34 homeruns in 2001-Grenoble's eight were a team high. Grenoble finished out his career with a .381 batting average, 86 hits, 74 rbi's, 14 HRs and 17 doubles.

On the basketball court, Justin was a letterman during the 1999-2000 season. As a starting forward/center, he was key in the team qualifying for the 2000 District IV playoffs having played through a severe ankle injury late in the season. His efforts resulted in a Mid-Penn Conference honorable mention selection.

Justin received the 2001 West Branch Valley Chapter's outstanding male senior sports award for Muncy High School.
