After finishing college, Marcie Wallis returned to her Alma Mater and has been a teacher with the Muncy School District for the past 15 years.

From 1977 to 1981, Marcie competed independently in swimming as Muncy did not (and still does not) have a school-sponsored swim team. She was the District IV Champion five times in several different events. Marcie won her first PIAA gold medal as a freshman, and never stopped bringing them home after that. She qualified for PIAA state competition in every event she swam each year at Districts. She was the first female in Lycoming County to place first in two individual events at PIAA Districts, and went undefeated as a 14-year old. During her stellar career, she broke and set over 50 records around the state.

At Bucknell University, Marcie was a member of the women's swim team three years, and for all four years, played as a member of the first ever women's water polo team, organized in 1982 by the swim coach. The Bucknell women's water polo team is now nationally ranked.

Since college, Marcie has been involved with numerous swim teams and swimmers, either coaching or providing clinics. She was the aquatics director at two YMCA'S, and organized two Master's swim teams in Virginia and Pennsylvania.

Marcie has taught swimming for 30 years and is currently the volunteer swim coach at Muncy High School for any PIAA competitors.
