Stan is one of the most beloved teachers and coaches to ever grace the halls of Muncy High School and is the only non-Muncy High School Graduate to be in the Muncy High School Athletic Hall of Fame.

Stan excelled at the Muncy High School athletic fields. After graduating from Watsontown High in 1933 and Bloomsburg State Teachers College in 1939, Stan brought his teaching expertise to Muncy, not only in the classroom but to the gridiron and mat room. Stan coached 17 years of Muncy football and 10 years of wrestling. Stan had excelled in wrestling at Bloomsburg State where he wrestled heavyweight. Stan also was Athletic Director for 10 years at Muncy.

On October 21, 1988 the Indians' football field was renamed the Stanley T. Schuyler Football Stadium in memory of him. This was to recognize his endeavors over the years for what he did in both the classroom and for the sports programs at Muncy.

His lasting legacy is alive and well as the Muncy Athletic Hall of Fame. He started the Hall of Fame after naming Larry Lauchle as the first inductee in 1975 and then at the All Sports banquet on April 23, 1976, named Bob Rohm and Ed Ott, two of the best all-Around athletes as the two newest members. Stan also announced that he was forming a Muncy sports hall of fame committee headed by Jim Brittain with others members to include Bob Wilt, Dave Wallis, Earl Poust and Paul Wertman. The committee was to continue the process of finding worthy candidate to induct into the Hall of Fame.

Stan is a member of the West Branch Valley Sports Hall of Fame.
