Career Readiness Grades 7-12:

Students will create and maintain a Career Readiness Portfolio grades 7th-12th. This is a continuation of their K-12 Career Readiness Portfolio.

<u>7th Grade-</u> All 7th grade students with take a 9-week Career Readiness required course. This course incorporates all four of the Career Readiness domains.

Guidance counselor meets individually with 7th grade students to discuss career thoughts/goals.

<u>8th Grade</u>- Guidance counselor meets individually with 8th grade students to discuss career thoughts and decide academic path to pursue in 9th grade (Business or Higher Education) based on current career path.

Skilled Technical Workforce presentation given by Technical Education teacher to all 8th grade students.

9th Grade- During Speech class students will complete a career interest inventory and research careers they would like to pursue after high school. Students will create a PowerPoint on a career of their choice and present it. Guidance Counselor views all career presentations.

LycoCTC representatives will speak to 9th grade students about opportunities available to them at LycoCTC. All 9th grade students will visit Lyco CTC and explore two careers of their choice. Students will also be exposed to a non-traditional career during their visitation.

Guidance counselor meets with 9th grade students to discuss career path for 10th grade (LycoCTC, Business or High Education).

<u>10th Grade</u>- All 10th grade students will complete a job shadowing experience for a day in a career of interest. They will complete a job shadowing packet as a way of evaluating their experience.

Guidance counselor meets with 10^{th} grade students to evaluate current career path and whether any academic changes need to be made.

All 10th grade students with take a 9-week required Personal Finance course. This course incorporates all four of the Career Readiness domains.

11th Grade- Students are given the opportunity to complete another job shadowing experience.

Guidance counselor meets individually with students to discuss life after high school (work, college, military) and what needs to be done to achieve their goal.
