CAG Supporting Momentum Scholarship Fund

- Attend an accredited institution of higher education
- Achieved a minimum grade point average of 3.0 (B)
- Well-rounded as demonstrated through involvement in extra-curricular activities, including but not limited to athletics, the arts, school government, community volunteerism or employment
- Demonstrated academic success and in compliance with the school district's code of conduct policy
- Submit letters of recommendation from non-related individuals such as school faculty, district administrative personnel, employer, coach or community member

Shirley Gray Rightmire Scholarship Fund

- Attend an accredited institution of higher education
- Plans to pursue a degree in education

Albert and Alice Nacinovich Music Scholarship Fund

- Attend, full-time, an accredited institution of higher education
- Plans to pursue a degree in music education or a music-related field of study
- Maintained a grade point average of 80 or higher
- While unmet financial need and academic accomplishments will be carefully considered, priority will be given to students who exemplify an exceptional passion and aptitude for music, demonstrate the potential to succeed, and who have shared their musical talents with their school, church, and/or the community
- The actual award of scholarship funds would be after satisfactory completion of one (1) year in a music focused program at an institution of higher education with a commitment to continue towards a degree in music.

FCFP Regional Scholarship Fund

- Graduating student from a high school (public, private, parochial, or home-schooled) located in Lycoming, Montour, Northumberland, Snyder, or Union County
- Attend an accredited college, university, or vocational school that offers a two (2) or four (4) year degree or certification program
- Recipients will be chosen based on the strength of an essay answering a question that is determined by FCFP staff on a year-to-year basis (complete initial application to review essay question)
- Such factors as class rank and grade point average will not be criteria in making a selection unless in the judgement of the selection committee such factors are needed to distinguish between multiple potential candidates

ISCALC International Scholarship Fund

- Attend an accredited institution of higher education
- Plans to pursue major coursework in the area of international studies, including but not limited to international affairs, foreign languages, overseas exchange programs, multicultural studies, or related areas

Jody Lea Loudenslager Scholarship Fund

- Be a current Glenn O. Hawbaker employee or a child of a current Glenn O. Hawbaker employee
- Attend an accredited two- or four-year institution of higher education
- Graduating high school senior or current college student may be considered

Kenneth and Marcia Johnson Scholarship Fund

- Applicants must be a graduate of a private or public high school or an accredited home school or cyber school program who resides in Clinton, Columbia, Lycoming, Montour, Northumberland, Tioga, Snyder, Sullivan, or Union County
- Applicants must be accepted or currently enrolled into either a full-time accredited undergraduate degree program or accredited technical/trade school and have a demonstrated financial need
- Applicants should be well rounded students and destined to do well in their chosen field, as demonstrated by their work ethic and/or participation in community and school activities

Preference shall be given as follows:

- Applicants that are a graduating senior(s) or have graduated from Clinton, Columbia, Lycoming, Montour, Northumberland, Tioga, Snyder, Sullivan, or Union County pursuing a career in aviation, including but not limited to technical certification as an aircraft & power plant mechanic (A&P), an avionics technician, pilot training leading to advanced certifications, air traffic controller or aeronautical engineer. Priority shall be given to a student who resides in Lycoming County

- Applicants that have graduated from a Clinton, Columbia, Lycoming, Montour, Northumberland, Tioga, Snyder, Sullivan, or Union County private or public school, or an accredited home school or cyber school currently pursuing a career in aviation, including but not limited to technical certification as an aircraft & power plant mechanic (A&P), an avionics technician, pilot training leading to advanced certifications, air traffic controller or aeronautical engineer. Priority shall be given to a student who resides in Lycoming County
- Previously awarded scholarship recipients may reapply for up to three (3) additional years
- If in any year there are no applicants who are pursuing a career in aviation, preference shall be given to a graduating senior from a Lycoming County high school

Richard P. Lauchle Forestry Scholarship Fund

Preference shall be given in the following order:

- Accepted or currently enrolled in Pennsylvania College of Technology's Forest Technology program.
- Accepted or currently enrolled in any other accredited Forest Technology program.
- Current resident of Centre, Clinton, Columbia, Juniata, Lycoming, Mifflin, Montour, Northumberland, Perry, Snyder, Sullivan or Union Counties of Pennsylvania
- Must demonstrate through an essay their appreciation for the forest and wood products industry

Robert E. Barbour Scholarship Fund

- Attend an accredited institution of higher education
- Plans to pursue a career as a pharmacist
- Preference will be given to student(s) graduating from Montoursville Area High School
- Additional preference will be given to student(s) with a demonstrated commitment to community service

Taylor J. Ertel Scholarship for Foster Children

- PA resident who has been placed in foster care by a child welfare agency at some point in their lives
- Admitted to a program of study: training may range from short vocational courses such as cosmetology, data entry or welding, through college and graduate study

Tim Lichter Memorial Scholarship Fund

- Attend, part-time or full-time, an accredited motorcycle mechanic school
- Additional consideration will be given for automotive technology, service technician, or welding
- Preference will be given to applicants that have unmet financial need
- Other than a strong potential for success, such factors as class rank and grade point average will not be criteria in making selection unless in the judgment of the selection committee such factors are needed to distinguish between multiple potential candidates

T-Ross Brothers Construction Scholarship I and II

- Graduating senior from a high school in Lycoming, Montour, Northumberland, Snyder or Union County
- Attend an accredited college/university, vocational school or trade school and plans to pursue a degree in a construction-related field of study
- Must have maintained at least a B average
- Preference given to a student who has background experience related to the construction industry
- Preference given to a student who intends to study construction technology with a concentration in carpentry or construction management
- Secondary preference given to a student pursuing a degree in architectural engineering
